“BEAR MUCH FRUIT AND
BECOME MY DISCIPLES”

John 15:8

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,



As followers of Jesus, we are called to a life of purpose and productivity. In John 15:8, Jesus says, “Bear much fruit and become my disciples.” This invitation is not just a suggestion, but a

command that requires our active engagement and commitment.

Firstly, “Bear Fruits” - Jesus’ disciples are expected to produce fruits of love, which demands concrete actions and not just empty words. Our Lord has shown us the ultimate example of love by being with us, showing us what is possible, and ultimately dying for us on the Cross. What could be the fruits of our love? What are the tangible expressions of our love for God and neighbor and the Church?

Secondly, “Become Disciples” - being a disciple of Jesus is not just a title, but an active engagement in the works of faith. Passive attendance at Mass, praying at home, or going to church once a week is not enough. Just like an athlete, such as boxers, who must train hard, discipline themselves, and practice daily to master their craft, we too must actively participate in building God’s Kingdom. This task is a shared responsibility, and everyone is required to contribute.

The Church exists for this task. She is God’s instrument of peace and love in the world. The Church is there to father all people so all can love and serve the Lord and one another. As members we are all called to be active disciples, participating in various ministries, volunteering our time and talents, and supporting each other in our spiritual journey. Look at our bulletin, and you will see the many opportunities to participate. Only then can we together grow and fulfill our calling.

In summary, bearing much fruit and becoming disciples of Jesus requires our intentional effort and commitment. We must move beyond mere words and take concrete actions that demonstrate our love for God, the church, and our neighbor. As we do so, we will become active disciples, building God’s church, and securing eternal life. We risk losing our lives for God and his empire of love rather than risking our souls for not doing anything worthy of his call. Let us heed Jesus’ call and bear much fruit, becoming His true disciples. Let us live the Mission with Christ.

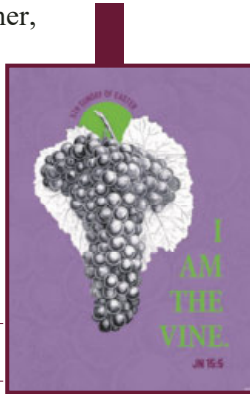


