#### DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,



Pentecost, the birthday of the Church, marks a pivotal moment when the divine infusion of life transforms timid disciples into bold proclaimers of the Good News! God, in His infinite

mercy, has saved humanity through Jesus Christ, and this revelation ignites a fire of faith that cannot be contained! Since the dawn of the Church, this Pentecostal power has continued to course through the veins of believers, animating them to share the Gospel with unbridled enthusiasm. Through the Seven Sacraments, the Church channels this divine Life, nourishing and empowering us on our earthly pilgrimage.

The same Spirit that drove the Holy Apostles, St. Junipero Serra, and the Franciscans to evangelize this land with unrelenting zeal now beckons us to join the mission! On March 17, 2024, Bishop Michael Barber S.J. declared the Mission Church, a beacon of hope and faith for over two centuries, a diocesan shrine of St. Joseph, a sacred destination for the faithful and beyond. The Mission Church and Museum should therefore serve as a vibrant hub of faith and spirituality, evangelization, and education. Soon, we will take a close look at the Mission and Museum to improve and upgrade them where needed so that we can adequately and effectively serve as a shrine of St. Joseph. This means we will do the following:

- 1. Continue to celebrate devoutly** the Sacraments and devotional practices.
- 2. Offer new retreat and pilgrimage opportunities** to pilgrims and visitors.
- 3. Add a welcoming pilgrim center reception space** in the Museum, offering warm hospitality to all.

**4. Upgrade and improve the Museum exhibit spaces** to provide dynamic and life-changing encounters with the sacred story of faith embedded in the history of the land and people.

**5. Amplify our communications** to reflect our core mission, goals and Catholic identity as a missionary community of disciples.

We will begin immediately after the 227th anniversary of the Mission which will take place on June 8-9, 2024. Join us on this exhilarating journey, as we seek to welcome not only 10,000 visitors per year, but 100,000 pilgrims and transform lives through the power of God, sacred history, and faith! If you are interested in becoming a Mission Ambassador for tours, you can help us spread the Good News to all!

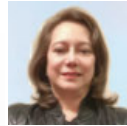

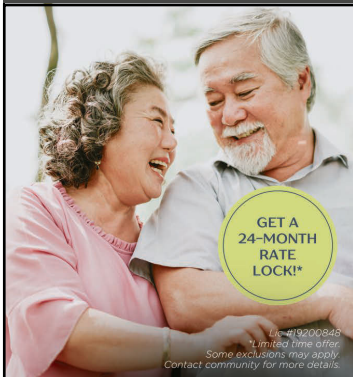

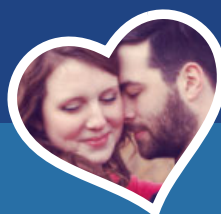
