CELEBRATING THE GIFT OF LIFE: Embracing the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,



Today, we joyfully celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus, our true food and drink! The Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of our life, and it is a wonderful gift of faith that we believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

Is it possible that the Lord is present in the forms of bread and wine? Is it possible that the words of Jesus said by the ordained priest have the power to change the bread and wine into his body and blood? Yes, it is possible if we believe in God.

Our God is not just a thing, but the source of all things, who loves and cares for us unconditionally! With His powerful Word, He created heaven and earth, and His Word has the power to heal, raise the dead, and make the impossible possible! That God makes himself visible in the person of Jesus.

Jesus, both God and Man, has the power to change the substance of bread and wine, while keeping their appearance. If we believe in His Word and what He has done, then it's not only possible but a joyful reality to believe in the Holy Eucharist! Miraculously, he was slowly getting better after participating in Mass, talks, confessions, adoration, and veneration of relics of Blessed Carlo. For the mother, this is a miracle thanks to the intercession of Blessed Carlo Acutis and I believe her! This healing "miracle" reminds us that the Lord continues to show signs of His presence in our lives, and we can't help but rejoice!

As we celebrate our children's First Communion and Confirmation, let us remember that Jesus is real and truly present in the Eucharist. Let us receive Him with love, adoration, and gratitude!

Congratulations to our Confirmation students! May the Spirit of God help them receive the Lord and become witnesses in the world. May we all celebrate the greatest gift of love, the Holy Eucharist, with devotion, appreciation, and joy!

We believe, therefore we live! Let us cherish the gift of the Holy Eucharist and nourish our spiritual lives with the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation. Let us come to the table with enthusiasm, knowing that we are receiving the very presence of Jesus, our Lord and Savior!

One with each other, Lord, for one in thee, who art one Savior and one living Head; then open thou our eyes, that we may see; be known to us in breaking of the Bread.



When Moses came to the people and related all the words and ordinances of the LORD, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the LORD has told us." Moses then wrote down all the words of the LORD and, rising early the next day, he erected at the foot of the mountain an altar and twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then, having sent certain young men of the Israelites to offer holocausts and sacrifice young bulls as peace offerings to the LORD, Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls; the other half he splashed on the altar. SECOND READING - Hebrews 9:11-15

Brothers and sisters: When Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be, passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God. For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.



GOSPEL - Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.




