The Mission's museum showcases artifacts, exhibits, and displays that bring its history to life, educating students and visitors about the Catholic faith, the lives of the Ohlone people, the Spanish missionaries, and the early settlers.

Mission San José has been a place of learning for many people. Today it remains a popular destination for personal retreats, pilgrimages, and field trips. We offer educational programs, tours, and workshops that explore its history, culture, people, and Catholic spirituality.


GUIDED TOURS OF HISTORIC MISSION SAN JOSÉ


