

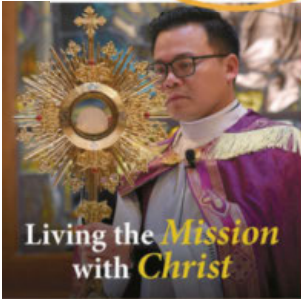

**THE POWER OF THE MUSTARD SEED:  
HOW SMALL BEGINNINGS CAN LEAD TO SIGNIFICANT CHANGE**

### DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,

The principle of the mustard seed, as mentioned in the Bible (Matthew 17:20, Mark 11:23, and Luke 17:6), teaches us that even the smallest of beginnings can lead to monumental outcomes. This concept applies to various aspects of our lives, including personal growth, habits, and spiritual development. The mustard seed principle can inspire us to make positive changes, no matter how small they may seem.

#### **Small Beginnings, Significant Impact.**

Many of us aspire to make positive changes in our lives, but we often feel overwhelmed by our own limitations or circumstances. However, the mustard seed principle reminds us that great things can start with tiny beginnings. As you commit to

this small daily practice, you'll begin to experience the transformative power of prayer in your life.

#### **Steps to Cultivate a Prayer Habit**

- 1. Set aside 5 minutes daily for prayer and reading.**
- 2. Choose a dedicated time and space for your prayer practice.**
- 3. Start small, but be consistent.**
- 4. Trust that God will bless your efforts and guide you forward.**

The mustard seed principle encourages us to embrace small beginnings and trust in the potential for growth and transformation. By starting with tiny, manageable habits and consistently nurturing them over time, we can experience profound changes in our lives and the lives of those around us. So, let us embrace the power of the mustard seed and watch how God can multiply our small efforts into something truly remarkable.

## GOSPEL - Mark 4:26-34

Jesus said to the crowds: "This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come." He said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it?"

It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.
