

JESUS' HEALING MIRACLES: A CELEBRATION OF HOPE AND JOY!

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST.



We are all on a journey of life, and at times, we may find ourselves wounded and in need of healing. But fear not, for Jesus is our Great Physician, and His healing miracles are a testament to His boundless love and compassion!

At the heart of our Mission Museum Renewal Plan is the recreation of St. Joseph Chapel of Healing. In this holy chapel, we commemorate eight miraculous healings performed by Jesus, as depicted in eight beautiful paintings. These masterpieces showcase Jesus' mercy and love for people from all walks of life, reminding us that we can approach Him with confidence in our times of need.

The first four miracles of healing demonstrate Jesus' power to restore and redeem:

- Healing of the official's son (Matthew 8:5-13, Luke 7:1-10): Jesus' compassion knows no bounds, and He heals the son of an official, restoring hope to a desperate father.
- Healing of Peter's mother-in-law (Matthew 8:14-15, Mark 1:29-31, Luke 4:38-39): Jesus' love extends to the family of His disciples, healing Peter's mother-inlaw and showing us the importance of caring for one another.
- Healing of many sick in the evening (Matthew 8:16-17, Mark 1:32-34, Luke 4:40-41): Jesus' healing power is limitless, and He restores health to numerous people, demonstrating His desire to alleviate suffering.
- Healing a man with leprosy (Matthew 8:1-4, Mark 1:40-45, Luke 5:12-14): Jesus' compassion knows no bounds, and He heals a man afflicted with leprosy, showing us the importance of empathy and understanding.
- **Healing of two blind men** (*Matthew 9:27-31*): Jesus' power is manifest in the healing of two blind men, restoring their sight and filling them with joy.

- Healing of a woman with a flow of blood (Matthew 9:20-22, Mark 5:21-43, Luke 8:40-48): Jesus' compassion extends to a woman suffering from a flow of blood, healing her and restoring her dignity.
- Healing of a paralyzed man (*Matthew 9:1-8*, *Mark 2:1-12*, *Luke 5:17-26*): Jesus' healing power is evident in the restoration of a paralyzed man, showing us the importance of faith and perseverance.
- Healing of a Syrophoenician woman's daughter (Matthew 15:21-28, Mark 7:24-30): Jesus' love knows no borders, and He heals the daughter of a Syrophoenician woman, demonstrating His compassion for all nations.

These eight miracles remind us that Jesus is always with us, ready to heal our wounds and restore our hope. As we journey through life, let us hold on to His promise of healing and redemption, and may the St. Joseph Chapel of Healing be a beacon of joy and hope for all who enter!

In each of these paintings, St Joseph will be presented as a constant and faithful spiritual father, the hope of the sick as he prays for us. These paintings will showcase Jesus' mercy and love for people of all ages, cultures, and continents, reminding us that we can approach Him with confidence in our times of need.

The chapel will also house relics from St. Joseph's carpenter shop and Mary's parents' old house, serving as a poignant reminder of the Lord's power to create life and conquer death. He became man and dwelt among us!

As we journey through life, let us not hesitate to reach out to God in times of joy and sorrow. May St. Joseph and the Blessed Mother Mary intercede for our healing, and may we always seek first the Lord, trusting in His divine love and compassion.





Where charity and love prevail, There God is ever found; Brought here together by Christ's love, By love are we thus bound.


