



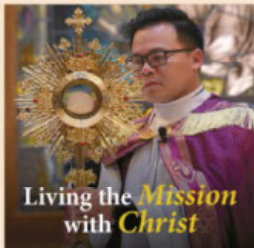

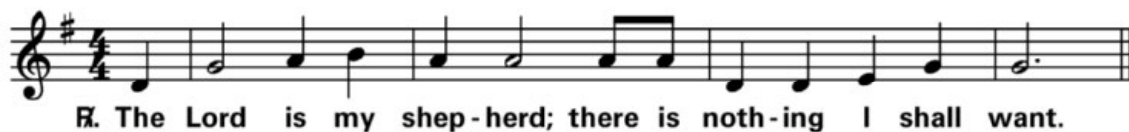
FIRST READING - *Jeremiah 23:1-6*

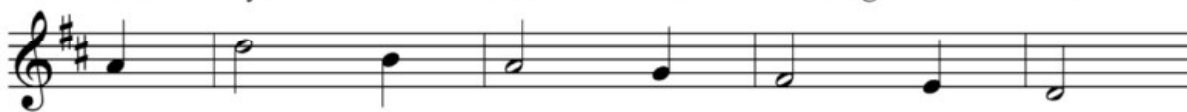

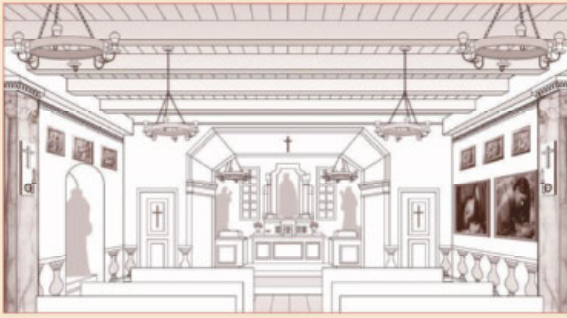


