

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

As followers of Christ, we are faced with a choice: to simply listen to Jesus' teachings or to truly follow Him. The difference between these two approaches is stark, and it is a distinction that Jesus Himself makes clear.

On one hand, there are those who listen to Jesus but fail to understand or obey Him. They become so familiar with His teachings that they begin to take them for granted, missing the depth and power of His words. They see Jesus as a mere mortal, a man they think they know, rather than the Son of God who holds the keys to eternal life.

On the other hand, there are those who take Jesus at His word. They accept Him as the arbiter of truth, recognizing that His teachings are not just suggestions or guidelines, but the very essence of reality and truth that sets us free from lies and falsehood. They conform their lives to His truth, daring to believe that He is indeed the Bread of Life. At Mass, we have the privilege of receiving Jesus' true Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist. This is not a symbolic act, but a sacramentally true encounter with the living God. As we receive Him, we are nourished and sustained for our journey of faith.

So, who are we? Are we those who simply listen to Jesus, or are we those who truly follow Him? Do we accept His teachings as truth, or do we try to fit Him into our own preconceptions?

Let us pray that we are like the good soil, receptive to Jesus' word and bearing fruit in abundance. May we be blessed with the gift of faith, that we may truly take Jesus at His word and follow Him with our whole hearts.

O love the Lord, his holy ones; His mercy will not fail. To those who seek his holy grace, All goodness shall prevail.




