DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS.

As Jesus stood on the eve of His arrest and crucifixion, He asked His disciples to spend an hour with Him in prayer (Matthew 26:40). This poignant request reveals the depth of His desire for communion with Us. Today, He asks the same question: "Can you spend an hour with Me?"

In our busy lives, dedicating an hour to God may seem daunting. Yet, consider this paradox: the more time we spend with God, the more time we have for other things (Proverbs 22:4). How? By adoring God, our faith is strengthened, and we're blessed by His presence.

Strengthen Our Faith

In God's presence, our faith grows, and we're reminded that we're not alone (Hebrews 13:5-6). As we gaze upon the Blessed Sacrament, we're drawn into the mystery of Christ's love (1 Corinthians 11:24-25). Our faith is fortified, and we're empowered to face life's challenges with courage and hope (Romans 15:13).

Gain Wisdom and Clarity

Listening to God, we gain insights into His will and truth (Proverbs 9:10). Our vision clears, and we make wise decisions, unshackled from the world's noise and distractions (James 1:5). As we seek God's guidance, we're transformed by the renewing of our minds (Romans 12:2), and our hearts are purified (1 Peter 1:22).

Better Discernment and Many Blessings

Time with God helps us discern His blessings and say "no" to worries (Matthew 6:33). We receive what we truly need, and our lives are transformed (Philippians 4:19). As we surrender to God's will, we experience the peace that surpasses all understanding (Philippians 4:7), and our hearts are filled with joy and gratitude (1 Thessalonians 5:18).

May these reasons inspire you to spend a Holy Hour with God. As the psalmist writes, "Blessed are those who seek Him with their whole heart" (Psalm 28:6). May our time with God transform our lives, and may we be blessed with His presence, wisdom, and blessings.

One with each other, Lord, for one in thee, who art one Savior and one living Head; then open thou our eyes, that we may see; be known to us in breaking of the Bread.


