


TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME August 25, 2024

DEAR ALL IN CHRIST.

The Holy Eucharist, a central sacrament in Christianity, has long been a source of fascination and controversy. For many, particularly those of Jewish descent, the concept of consuming the body and blood of Christ is difficult to accept. Traditional reasons for this skepticism include the prohibition on eating human flesh and drinking blood, which would render one ritually unclean for worship (Leviticus 7:26). Additionally, the claim that Jesus is the son of God and the true bread from heaven can be challenging to grasp (John 6:32-33).

In fact, Jesus' own disciples struggled with this teaching, leading many to abandon their fellowship (John 6:60-66). Today, a staggering 70% of Catholics in the USA do not believe that the Holy Eucharist is truly the body and blood of Christ. So, how can we understand and embrace this sacred mystery?

Believing in Jesus as God. The foundation of faith in the Holy Eucharist lies in our belief in Jesus as God incarnate. As Jesus Himself said, "I am the bread of life; he who comes to Me shall not hunger, and he who believes in Me shall never thirst" (John 6:35). If we acknowledge Jesus as the divine Son of God, we must recognize that He cannot deceive us. God is truth itself. There is no falsehood in him. His power to transform bread and wine into His body and blood is within His capabilities, having already demonstrated His divinity through miracles such as turning water into wine (John 2:1-11) and raising the dead (John 11:1-44).

The Testimony of the Early Church. The early Christian community took Jesus' words about the Eucharist with utmost seriousness, willing to sacrifice their lives for this belief. As St. Paul wrote, "For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night in which He was betrayed took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and said, 'This is My body which is for you; do this in remembrance of Me"

(1 Corinthians 11:23-24). Their conviction serves as a testament to the truth of the Holy Eucharist. As we approach the sacrament, we must acknowledge the depth of God's love, which makes Himself accessible to us in a sacramental way, under the signs of bread and wine (Matthew 26:26-30).

A New Way of Approaching the Lord. Belief in the Holy Eucharist demands a transformation in our attitude and behavior. As we attend Mass, we must recognize that we are encountering the living Lord in flesh and blood. Our attire, conduct and spiritual state should reflect reverence and respect for this sacred encounter. We do that in all the formal settings, so why not for God?

As St. Paul reminds us, "Let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup" (1 Corinthians 11:28). By freeing our souls from moral sins, we can fully receive the promise of this heavenly food and deepen our relationship with God (1 Corinthians 11:27-32).

As we continue on the journey of spiritual growth, may we cultivate a profound understanding and appreciation for the Holy Eucharist. May our faith in this sacred mystery guide us toward a more intimate connection with Christ, the source of eternal life (John 6:53-58).

Beginning in September, once a month we will have 24-hour adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from the first Friday morning to Saturday morning. Please sign up and spend an hour with God praying for your needs, our community, and our country.



SECOND READING - Ephesians 5:21-32

Brothers and sisters: Be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord. For the husband is head of his wife just as Christ is head of the church, he himself the savior of the body. As the church is subordinate to Christ, so wives should be subordinate to their husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the church and handed himself over for her to sanctify her, cleansing her by the bath of water with the word, that he might present to himself the church in splendor,

without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. So also husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one hates his own flesh but rather nourishes and cherishes it, even as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body. For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. This is a great mystery, but I speak in reference to Christ and the church.

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GOSPEL - John 6:60-69

Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" Since Jesus knew that his disciples were murmuring about this, he said to them, "Does this shock you? What if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life. But there are some of you who do not believe." Jesus knew from the beginning the ones who would not

believe and the one who would betray him. And he said, "For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father." As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. Jesus then said to the Twelve, "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God.

This is the bread of God coming down from heav'n, giving life to us, to all the world.


