THE DANGERS OF DISREGARDING GOD'S COMMANDS:
A LESSON FROM THE PHARISEES

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,

In the Bible, the Lord critiques the Pharisees for their hypocritical lifestyle, emphasizing the importance of aligning our actions with God's teachings (Matthew 15:1-20, Mark 7:1-23). The Pharisees meticulously observed human traditions like handwashing and cup-cleaning, judging others for not conforming. However, they neglected to address the evil in their hearts, such as murder, theft, and deceit (Matthew 23:27-28).

The Lord exposes their hypocrisy, revealing that He sees beyond outward appearances to the heart (Luke 16:15, Hebrews 4:13). This serves as a warning for us, as we may also be tempted to prioritize our own ideas over God's teachings. We might condone disregarding life in the womb, ignoring our biological makeup, or neglecting Sunday Mass, despite God's clear commands (Exodus 20:13, Genesis 1:27, Acts 20:7).

As Christians, we are challenged to let go of our false gods, listen to the Lord, and follow His precepts (Deuteronomy 30:19, Joshua 24:15). If we believe He is the truth and life, why contradict Him? Our human weakness and wounded nature may make it difficult, but we can seek mercy and courage from Him to continue on the path of holiness (Psalm 51:10-12, Romans 8:13).

Let us recommit ourselves to embracing the Lord's commands, striving to do less wrong each day. May we welcome God's mercy and guidance, embarking on a journey of growth and devotion (Proverbs 9:10, Jeremiah 29:13).

Reflection Questions:

1. How do I prioritize God's commands in my life?
2. Are there areas where I disregard His teachings for human traditions or personal convenience?
3. How can I seek mercy and courage to recommit to the path of holiness?

Prayer:

Dear Lord, help me to align my actions with Your teachings. Grant me the courage to let go of my false gods and prioritize Your commands. May Your mercy guide me on the journey of holiness, doing less wrong each day and embracing Your truth and life (John 14:6).

GOSPEL - *Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23*

When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands. —For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the marketplace they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds. — So the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, “Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?”

He responded, “Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written: *This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts.* You disregard God’s commandment but cling to human tradition.” He summoned the crowd again and said to them, “Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile. “From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile.”

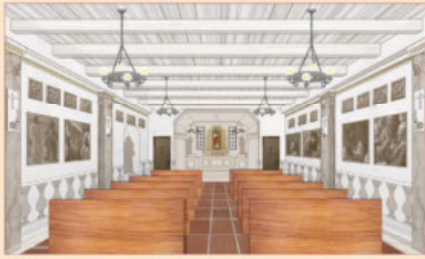


