Mission Statement: Our St. Joseph family is living the mission with Christ through the works of faith, charity and mercy.



DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,

The prophet Isaiah reminds us, “Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand” (Isaiah 41:10). This fundamental truth of faith is echoed in 1 John 4:18, “There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love.”

Our lives can be plagued by various fears. Fear of sickness, fear of sharing our faith, fear of rejection, fear of being alone, or fear of committing to a healthy relationship blessed by God. But what is the root cause of our fear? Whatever it may be, it paralyzes us from becoming the best and happiest person God wants us to be.

To strengthen our lives and overcome fear, let us build our lives on these realities of faith:

First, God is here, and He is Good. God is way bigger than any source of fear we may have. He loves us unconditionally and respects our freedom infinitely (Psalm 139:1-4, Romans 8:37-39). We can choose to love Him or reject Him. Loving Him brings true joy and freedom; rejecting Him opens the gates for false gods that will eventually bring us down and trap us in our ideologies (Matthew 6:24).

Second, Jesus is our divine Savior. He heals not only physical sickness but also makes us realize we are loved and accepted by Him (Matthew 9:10-13,

Luke 5:27-32). The Lord wants our broken hearts to heal! He is our physician of the soul (Psalm 147:3, Isaiah 61:1-3)! With Jesus, fear of rejection disappears (Romans 8:1); with Jesus, forgiveness is given (Ephesians 1:7); with Jesus, a second chance is always on offer (John 8:1-11). With Him, fear quickly disappears since He is our stronghold, and we can take refuge in Him (Psalm 91:2).

Third, we can go to God. God is not scary; He is holy (Leviticus 11:44, 1 Peter 1:16)! Sometimes our sinfulness makes us feel intimidated, but don't be! The devil wants us to believe God is mean, but He is loving and merciful (Exodus 34:6-7, Psalm 103:8-14). Pray to Him, connect with Him, spend time hearing His word, and gaze at Him in the chapel of adoration. Fear disappears when our hearts connect with God's heart, filled with love and joy (Psalm 16:11, John 15:11).

May the Lord help us overcome our fears with faith and truth. As Psalm 27:1 says, “The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life of whom shall I be afraid?”

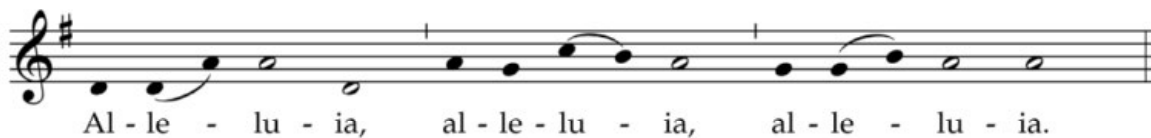

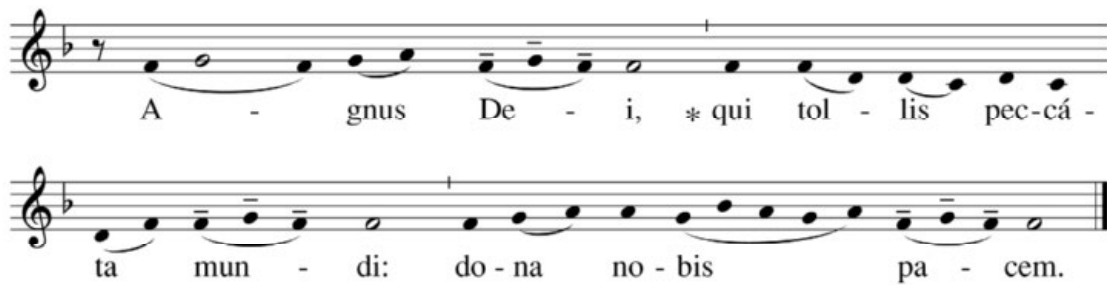

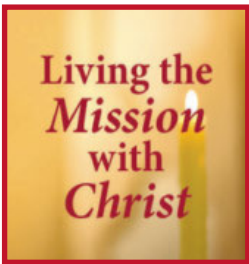
As we progress through the Mission Museum Renewal Project, we will guide you step by step, offering you a glimpse into the transformation of each space within our historical and holy sanctuary.


