Mission Statement: Our St. Joseph family is living the mission with Christ through the works of faith, charity and mercy.



DEAR FRIENDS IN CHRIST,

We are reminded that “faith without works is dead” (James 2:26). Having faith is not enough; we must put it into practice. As Jesus says, “Not everyone who says to me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven” (Matthew 7:21).

If we claim to have faith but do not help those in need, we are not being honest with ourselves. A true faith requires compassion and action, just like the Good Samaritan who showed mercy to the man in need (Luke 10:25-37). As Proverbs 3:27 says, “Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to do it.”

In Matthew 16:23, Jesus rebukes Peter, saying “Get behind me, Satan!” Peter had claimed Jesus as Lord, but he wanted to do things his own way. He denied the cross and was influenced by Satan. However, after rejecting Jesus three times, Peter returned to Him and proved his faith through his actions, even accepting martyrdom. As Jesus says, “Whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it” (Matthew 16:25).

How often do we try to make God fit our own image? We ask God to do things for us, but we don’t want to do what He asks of us. We talk about our rights, but ignore the innocent lives in the womb. As Psalm 82:3-4 says, “Defend the weak and the fatherless; uphold the cause of the poor and the oppressed. Rescue the weak and the needy; deliver them from the hand of the wicked.”

We claim to be people of God, but struggle to proclaim Him. We belong to the Church, but fail to contribute our time, talent, and treasure. As Jesus says, “Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also” (Matthew 6:21).

The truth is, if we don’t practice what we believe, our faith is worthless. Want to know the power of love? Love! As 1 John 3:18 says, “Let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth.” Want happiness? Do happy things! Want good health? Eat, drink, and think healthier things! Want respect? Respect others! As Romans 12:10 says, “Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves.” Do we want mercy? Act mercifully!

With joyful hearts, we’ve embraced three goals as a parish!

First, we delight in facilitating life-changing encounters with God in the sacred liturgy of the Church. As Psalm 100:4-5 says, “Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and bless his name,” we faithfully celebrate the liturgy with reverence and joy, just as the Church intends. We’re thrilled to tap into the immense richness of the Church’s liturgical heritage, reveling in the beauty and depth of our shared worship traditions. By doing so, we create a vibrant space for our community to connect with God and each other, just like the early Church in Acts 2:42-47, where “they devoted themselves to the

apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer."

Second, we empower people to be missionaries who live, proclaim, and share their faith, as Jesus commands in Matthew 28:18-20.

As Jesus commands in Matthew 28:18-20, "Go and make disciples of all nations," we recognize that this Great Commission is our singular mission. We're dedicated to equipping families to become domestic churches, where parents can confidently pass on the faith to their children, just as Proverbs 22:6 says, "Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it." By investing in faith formation programs and resources, we're supporting parents in their vital role as primary educators of their children's faith. Together, we're reigniting our passion for the mission, fueled by the love of God and the faith of the Church, and inspired by the words of Romans 10:14-15, "How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard?"

Third, we're committed to continuing the works of mercy, charity, and justice, living out the teachings of Matthew 25:31-46, where Jesus says, "Whatever you did for one of the least of these

brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

We're excited to share that our homeless ministry is getting a permanent home in the historic Carriage House on our campus! This will be a hub for storing and distributing non-perishable food, packing, and delivering essential items with love and care to our neighbors on the streets of Fremont. As Mother Teresa said, "The hunger for love is much more difficult to remove than the hunger for bread." We're answering Jesus' call to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and quench the thirsty. Join us in making this vital ministry a reality by volunteering and contributing to the Carriage House renovation. Together, let's demonstrate the Church's love and compassion, shining God's light in our community!

Remember, the Church cannot be the Church without doing the works of faith, mercy, and charity. We can not have faith and do not do the works of faith. Let us "come and follow," "imitate," and "go and proclaim to all nations" because faith without works is dead.

As the Mission San José embarks on a divine renovation and renewal, transforming the Mission Museum into a Pilgrim Center, Healing Chapel, and Museum, we are reminded of our sacred mission to share the good news of the Lord with all people. This transformation symbolizes the Church’s identity as a pilgrim church, following in the footsteps of the Lord to heaven, just as Abraham was called to leave his home and follow God’s promise (Genesis 12:1-3).

Upon entering the new Pilgrim Center, formerly the gift shop, visitors will be greeted with Christian Hospitality inspired by the spirit of St. Francis, whose love for all mirrors the love of Christ (John 13:34-35). This marks the beginning of a sacred and holy journey, guiding pilgrims and visitors through the Museum’s first room, where the divine story of God’s journey with humanity unfolds. The room showcases the significant stories of men and women of faith, highlighting their roles in our sacred journey back to God and Heaven. The journey begins with creation, where God made humanity in His likeness and image (Genesis 1:27), and continues through the fall (Genesis 3).

The room features key figures such as:

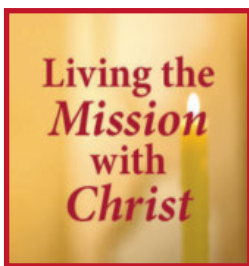
- **Noah**, who trusted God and built an ark, saving his family and two of every kind of animal (Genesis 6-9)

- **Abraham**, who was willing to sacrifice his son Isaac, trusting in God’s promise (Genesis 22)
- **Joseph**, who forgave his brothers and trusted in God’s sovereignty (Genesis 37, 45)
- **Moses**, who encountered God in the Burning Bush and led the Israelites out of slavery (Exodus 3-4, 12)
- **David**, who trusted God and defeated Goliath (1 Samuel 17)
- **The Holy Family – Joseph, Mary, and Jesus** – who embodied God’s love and grace (Matthew 1-2, Luke 2)

This sacred journey reminds us that we are invited to continue walking with the Lord, who promises to be with us until the end of times (Matthew 28:20). As we embark on this divine renovation and renewal, we are called to share the good news of the Lord with all people, inspiring a deeper connection with our faith and our mission. The transformed Pilgrim Center, Healing Chapel, and Museum will serve as a beacon of hope and guidance, welcoming pilgrims and visitors to embark on this sacred journey, deepening their understanding of our shared mission and the love of Christ. May we “run with perseverance the race marked out for us” (Hebrews 12:1) and may our hearts be filled with joy, peace, and love.

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
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
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
