



BEYOND WEALTH AND OBEDIENCE TO THE TORAH

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS

"Who then can be saved?" The astonished disciples of Jesus asked, pondering the rich young man's inability to attain eternal life despite his wealth and obedience to the Torah (first five books in the Bible). This encounter highlights a profound truth: salvation requires more than outward conformity; it demands a heart that loves God and others.

The rich young man, having kept the Ten Commandments and enjoyed blessing through his wealth, assumed he had secured righteousness and salvation. However, Jesus' response revealed a critical flaw: the man's heart lacked love for his neighbors. Despite claiming to observe the Commandments, his mind and heart are fixated on focusing on himself and his personal wealth, leaving no room for others. There is an absolute lack of generosity.

In Jewish law, love for God and neighbor is paramount (Deuteronomy 6:5, Leviticus 19:18). The rich young man's failure to demonstrate this love rendered his obedience hollow. Jesus emphasizes that even perfect observance of the law, without love, falls short.

The problem lies not in wealth itself but in the heart's orientation. Possessions can accumulate, blocking our vision of God and others, as seen in the parable of Lazarus and the rich man (Luke 16:19-31). The rich young man's heart was possessed by the spirit of physical wealth, leaving no room for spiritual and lasting wealth. So what is the solution?

Jesus' solution is clear: create space in your heart for God and others. Generosity, a vital virtue, enables us to look beyond our riches and see the needs of others. This is exemplified in Jesus' selfless gift of salvation, offered to all. In the Jewish tradition, giving 10% of one's income (Ma'aser) supported the temple and expanded God's kingdom. Today, we are invited to contribute to building God's kingdom, the community of the church, and ministries spreading the good news to all and sharing the love of God for those in need. So my friends, remember these:

- Salvation requires a heart that loves, not just outward obedience to the laws and policies! Both are required.
- Wealth can distract from spiritual priorities if it is not shared. It can be our "god."
- Generosity creates space for God and others in our hearts.
- Giving is essential to building God's kingdom and saving souls.
- 1. How do I prioritize love for God and neighbor?
- 2. Does my wealth or materialism distract me from spiritual growth?
- 3. Am I generous with my resources, time, and talents?

Dear Heavenly Father,

Help us recognize that true salvation requires a heart that loves. May our wealth and possessions not distract us from your love and the needs of others. Grant us generosity of spirit, that we may create space for you and others in our hearts. Amen.

Spotlight Ministry: Family of Faith

A Family of Faith. We baptized Catholics are considered family. We are sons and daughters of God, brothers and sisters in Christ. Coming to Mass is like going to a family reunion. *A Family of Faith* program is a family approach to passing on the faith (catechesis).

For many adults, learning the Faith meant going to CCD. Religious education mimicked school. Parents dropped off their children and ran errands while students gathered in classrooms with their peers to learn lessons. The responsibility of passing on the faith was left to the catechists.

Family of Faith Year-Long Project:

Journey to Heaven Board (Vazquez and Orallo Families)



We know parents are the primary teachers of their children. They are the most influential people in a child's life. When it comes to passing on the Faith, fathers

especially, have a pivotal role as head of the family, the 'domestic church.' The family approach to catechesis offered at St. Joseph Parish provides the family an opportunity to grow

together in faith. Parents and their children meet in small groups (Faith Families) together with other families to learn, discuss and actively live their faith.



The *A Family of Faith* program follows the 4 pillars of the Catechism of the Catholic Church: Profession of Faith, The Sacraments, Life in Christ and Christian

Prayer. Each year focuses on one pillar allowing families to gain a greater understanding of the teachings of the Church. During the year each family works on a year-long project and participates in service projects where they demonstrate their faith in action through *Works of Mercy*. In short, parents and children connect what they learn about Church teachings to their lives in a real, tangible way.

Our Catholic Faith is not practiced in isolation. As St. Mother Theresa said, "We belong to each other" and we read in Romans 12:5 "In the same way, we are many people, but in Christ we are all one body." We are family. We recognize Christ in the other when we serve others. Families in the *A Family of Faith* program serve Christ in the other by partnering with the Homeless Outreach Ministry to pack 'blessing' bags, support the St. Vincent de Paul Ministry by donating to their food drives and serve each other in contributing to a communal snack.

Our Family of Faith extends to include our homebound parishioners. Each Faith Family has a 'senior' buddy whom they support. We recognize we are a family of families from all walks of life; and are all on a journey back to Heaven. We walk together in faith and friendship, after all we are one family.

Notice Something Missing?

You may notice a few things missing from the Mission Church. St. Joseph Catholic Church/Mission San José in collaboration with the Committee for Restoration of the Mission San José and the California Missions Foundation, transported six gold-

framed paintings along with the Baptismal Font (all dating back to 1809) to an art conservator for testing, analysis, and conservation treatment.



The preservation of these interior objects are integral to Mission San José's plans to maintain and preserve the priceless artifacts as well as the physical structures of California's 14th Mission. These are the first to be addressed as a demonstration of this overall conservation plan. Upfront costs will be paid by the Committee for Restoration of the Mission San José, and treatment costs will likely be paid by the California Missions Foundation, along with private donors pledging their support. PART TWO: 21 CALIFORNIA MISSIONS:

The Missionary Path

Miguel Jose Serra was born on November 24, 1713, the son of a farmer at Petra, Majorca, in Spain's Balloric Isles. He was baptized at the parish church of Saint Peter's, and received his first education at the Franciscan Friary of San Bernardino. Both of these buildings, as well as the rough stone birth dwelling, may still be seen at Petra. On taking his religious vows in 1730 Serra took the name Junipero, after a beloved disciple of Saint Francis of Assisi. Later, the little padre, scarcely over 5 feet tall, who was to become the "Apostle of California" arrived in Mexico. There he and governor Portola planned, how to expand Spanish domain into Upper California by extending the chains of Missions northward.

Due to the uncertainties of the times, the soldier and the priest decided that their first effort, up to present San Diego, would be divided into five segments: three ships and two expeditions by land, all to leave at separate times. Padre Junipero Serra, and the governor riding on mules, were in the second land party. After many hardships crossing the virtual desert, both land parties reached San Diego to find only two of the ships in the harbor, with the crews and soldiers, who were passengers, badly decimated by scurvy. The third ship was never heard from.

Thus began he founding of the famous 21 missions of the California chain along "El Camino Real," the Kings Highway.

This famous California roadway runs the length of the state from San Diego to Sonoma, linking the "jewels" of the mission chain. Later, the name was often

translated as the "public highway" purposely ignoring the term "royal" as California became a republic, and then a state.

It was once just a foot trail. But as settlements and missions were established and the population grew, the trail became the main inland route for travelers. It was a stage line and eventually a highway, U.S. 101. With only a few detours, the present U.S. 101 is identical to the route the padres used. Its official historic marking is a mission bell the color of tarnished copper, arched over a single sign post with the words "El Camino Real."

The 21 missions that dot the California landscape from San Diego to Sonoma are the relics of an ambitious plan in the European conquest of the New World. The program used by the Spaniards to colonize California was unique among the methods tried in North America. The Spanish monarchy charged the Franciscan Order of the Catholic Church, in tandem with the Spanish military, to secure the western shores of what was called New Spain, establishing missions to convert the native Indian population to Christianity. Each mission would be the beginning of a civilian town, and they would be located at regular intervals upon the entire stretch of the colony. The missions' brief history is one of remarkable achievement and swift decline.


