DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST.

Fear is a basic instinctual emotion we all share. It allows us to react to something scary or difficult. As a child, I was fearful of the cemetery. Every time I walked by, I looked away and ran as fast as I could! Reflecting on our lives, we may identify things that cause us fear.

In 1 Kings, a widow faced famine and starvation. Prophet Elijah asked her to give her last meal to him as an offering to God's prophet. How could she give away the only thing securing her family's life? Doesn't it sound like an unfair request? "Do not be afraid," Elijah reassured her.

She feared impending death, worried about food and tomorrow, and prioritized her family's well-being. Legitimate concerns! Yet Elijah asked her to trust God's promise. She was invited to surrender fear, control and offer obedience and trust.

The Lord is a good God, always giving more than we deserve. He delivered His people from slavery and brought them to the Promised Land. Generous and merciful, He's ready to help His children. Elijah asked the widow to believe and demonstrate trust through action. She received more than she needed! Sometimes, fear becomes our guiding force, paralyzing us. We treat fears as gods, living life through that lens.

Jesus teaches the value of sincere and generous giving. Rich contributors like the Pharisees gave abundantly to the Temple, seeking praise from others. A poor widow only offered mere coins, but surpassed others in value (Mark 12:41-44). For God, it's not the amount that matters, but trust and faith.

At Saint Joseph and many other parishes in the diocese, only 10-20% of the faithful actually participate and contribute to the church and ministries. The Lord asks for a fraction of our time, talents, and treasure in order to further God's kingdom. As Catholics, sharing burdens and contributing to this mission is a moral and religious responsibility. It does not seem morally and ethically right when others come, receive, and enjoy what the church has to offer and do not contribute accordingly.

Don't let fear hold you back. Trust God's generosity and mercy. Give an hour to God, not just Netflix. Allocate a portion of your income to God's work as he has given us everything. Let's respond to God's invitation to generosity and gratitude. Don't be afraid to trust and contribute. The Lord will multiply our efforts, making His abundance available to all.

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths." (Proverbs 3:5-6) May we surrender our fears, embracing God's promise: "Do not be afraid."

- 2. How can I surrender control and trust God's promise?
- 3. What small step can I take today to overcome fear?
- 4. How can I contribute to God's work in my parish?
- 5. What blessings have I received from trusting God?



Spotlight Ministry: Confirmation



At St. Joseph Parish, our Confirmation Ministry is more than just a program; it's a transformative journey that connects our youth with their

faith, community, and each other. It is sacramental preparation, affirming the personal commitment to the life in faith that our parents chose for us long ago at Baptism. Through Confirmation we agree with their initial decision to raise us in the faith. It is also an opportunity for the candidates to grow with each other and learn what it means to be a Catholic in the modern world. Confirmation is a journey over two years, between 8th grade and high school, that brings students closer to the self, others, nature, (and especially) God.

In addition to catechesis, the program emphasizes the importance of community and service. Candidates participate in various service projects that allow them to put their faith into action. These experiences help them recognize their role in the church and the broader community, fostering a sense of responsibility and compassion. In the past we have made blessing bags for the homeless, collected food for the pantry, cleaned up trash at Lake Elizabeth, and even filled the Easter eggs for the yearly egg hunt.



The growth of our group was most notable this past spring, when our confirmation candidates embarked on a

retreat to Caritas Creek and immersed themselves in the theme "Harden Not Your Hearts." The experience left a lasting mark on many participants, creating bonds and profound reflections.

One unforgettable moment occurred during a beautiful rainstorm that swept through the retreat. As the skies darkened, thunder rumbled and rain poured down, shaking the building with intensity. Rather

than feeling fear, the candidates gathered in the common area, feeling an unexpected sense of awe.

As the weather raged outside, the group sat together, sharing their thoughts and feelings. Their hearts were open to God in that moment, knowing that it is not always so obvious when the Lord reveals himself to us. One candidate spoke up, expressing how the storm made him feel closer to God. He shared that in the midst of the chaos, he sensed a profound presence, a reminder of God's power and love enveloping them all. Moved by his words, the candidates began to reflect on their own experiences of God in the midst of life's storms, both literal and metaphorical.

Returning to St. Joseph Parish, the impact of that stormy night and hikes around the forest lingered in their hearts. The experience deepened their faith and fostered connections among them that would last

well beyond the retreat. Through moments like these, the Confirmation Ministry nurtures



belonging, faith, and compassion, reminding us all to "harden not our hearts" in the face of life's challenges.

None of this would be possible without the support of all the parents and volunteers that show immense love and give so much of themselves to make each event happen, whether it's being a greeter at Sunday Mass or chaperoning the weekend retreat, we have a strong community with so many important moving pieces. Thank you all. Here's to another wonderful year!

Mission Renewal Project

PART ONE: 21 CALIFORNIA MISSIONS: *The Missionary Path*

Although the Spanish occupation of California did not begin until 1769 forces were at work the year after the first voyage of Columbus, which ultimately brought Spanish missionaries to the Golden State of today. In 1493 Pope Alexander VI drew an arbitrary line on the map, which was to divide the spheres of interest of Spain and Portugal, and declared that all colonizers should be accompanied by "worthy God-fearing, learned, skilled, and experienced men to instruct the inhabitants in the Catholic faith." Controversy arose immediately. The religious element held that all men and women were brothers and sisters, and that the newly discovered territories belonged first to the King, and then to the original inhabitants. Colonists thought of the natives as sub-human beings with no right of private ownership. The King of Spain used both of the opposing forces, first one, then the other, to advance the expansion of the Spanish Empire.

Then Charles V issued a code of "New Laws" which eventually became the foundation of the California mission system. It stated that the Indians should be permitted to live in communities of their own; they should be permitted to choose their own leaders and councilors; no Indian to be held as a slave; no Indian to live outside his own village; no Spaniard to

stay in an Indian village for more than three days, and then only if he were a merchant or ill; and the Indians to be instructed in the Catholic faith.

Under the protection of these new laws, religious communities begin to spring up in Mexico, and Central America. Although strenuously opposed by Spanish plantation owners, and not given any great favor by the

King and his viceroys, even so the missionaries were self-supporting and provided an inexpensive means of securing frontiers against other European ambitions.

The court of King Philip II became the richest in Europe after Spanish conquest of islands of the Pacific such as the Philippines, Spanish galleon ships plying the vast Pacific, bringing treasures of the Orient, needed safe harbors on the western Mexican coast. It was Vizcaino in 1602 who first discovered Monterey Bay and first described upper California as the land of "milk and honey" - the best port that could be sheltered from all winds, much wood and water, settlements of friendly Indians; springs of good water; beautiful lakes covered with ducks and many other birds; good meadows for cattle; fertile fields for growing crops. Yet the discovery gave Spain no immediate advantage. A hundred years later, their influence extended only up the barren coast of Lower California, where the Jesuits had established a chain of missions.

The Jesuits had made their own rules and commanded their own security forces. This was not to be tolerated by secular elements. Eventually, the Jesuits were replaced in Mexico by the Franciscans, who were to extend the mission system into upper California—but under the control of and in cooperation with Spanish authorities.


