The Holy Family: A Reflection of God's <u>Love</u>

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS.

As we contemplate the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, we are reminded of the profound significance of family in God's plan of salvation. From the dawn of creation, God has revealed His design for human relationships through the family. In Genesis, we read that God created man and woman in His own image, establishing the foundation for the family unit (Genesis 1:26-27).

The family is often referred to as the "school of love" because it is within this sacred institution that we learn the values of love, sacrifice, and selflessness. As St. Paul writes, "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud" (1 Corinthians 13:4). It is here that we experience the beauty of relationships, the joy of belonging, and the comfort of being loved. The family is where we discover our identity, develop our values, and learn to navigate the complexities of human relationships.

In the Holy Family, we see the perfect example of love, obedience, and trust. Jesus, the Son of God, submits Himself to the authority of His earthly parents, Mary and Joseph, demonstrating the importance of humility and obedience (Luke 2:51-52). Mary, the Mother of God, exemplifies the virtues of faith, hope, and charity, while Joseph, the foster father of Jesus, shows us the value of trust, protection, and provision (Matthew 1:19-25).

The family is not only a human institution but also a divine one. God Himself has revealed His Trinitarian nature as a family of love, with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit united in perfect harmony (Matthew 28:19). In this sense, the family is a reflection of God's own nature, a microcosm of the divine love that unites the Three Persons of the Trinity.

As we reflect on the Holy Family, we are reminded that each one of us is called to live out our respective roles within our own families. Husbands and wives are called to love and serve each other, just as Christ loves and serves His Church (Ephesians 5:25-33). Parents are called to nurture and educate their children, teaching them the values of faith, hope, and charity (Proverbs 22:6). Children are called to obey and honor their parents, learning from them the ways of love and obedience (Ephesians 6:1-3).

In a world where family values are often eroded, the Holy Family stands as a beacon of hope and inspiration. May we look to Jesus, Mary, and Joseph as our models, striving to live out our family relationships with love, compassion, and selflessness. May we recognize the sacredness of family life and the importance of preserving and promoting it in our society.

Prayer: Dear Heavenly Father,

We thank You for the gift of family, a treasure that reflects Your own divine love. We ask for Your blessing upon all families, that they may be filled with love, peace, and harmony (Psalm 128:1-6). May the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph be our model and inspiration, guiding us to live out our family relationships with faith, hope, and charity.

We pray for husbands and wives, that they may love and serve each other as Christ loves and serves His Church (Ephesians 5:25-33). We pray for parents, that they may nurture and educate their children in the ways of faith, hope, and charity (Proverbs 22:6). We pray for children, that they may obey and honor their parents, learning from them the values of love and obedience (Ephesians 6:1-3).

May Your divine love be the foundation of our families, and may we always recognize the sacredness of family life. We ask this through the intercession of the Holy Family, and in the name of Your Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.







History and People of Mission San José PART 11

Continued from last week's article

2. October, 1798

- a. Soldiers brought 33 Sacklan Indians to San José.
 - The Indians ran away from Mission San Francisco.
 - ii. The soldiers let them go to San José "because of the horror with which they regard the mission of San Francisco"
- 3.1805 Father Uria headed the construction of building a new church.
- 4. April, 1806 A measles outbreak started.
 - a. Lasted six weeks. Three-fourths of children under 5 years old died. So did half the adult women and one-fourth of the adult men.
 - b. Ended in mid-April.
- April, 1806 Father Buenaventura Fortuny and Father Narciso Duran arrived.

6. Post April, 1806

- a. G. H. von Langsdorff visited and stated the following
 - i. mission had lots of corn and wheat in storage.
 - ii. "maize, barley, pease, beans and other grains."
 - iii. few trees nearby because he thought this was because the natives set fire to woods and burned the trees down.
- Indian houses were not built yet. They lived in reed houses like the ones in their villages.

7. April, 1809

- a. April 22, 1809 An adobe-brick church was finished.
 - Father Tapis (who followed Father Lasuen as mission Presidente) came to bless (Dedicate) it.
 - ii. church was plain outside, but decorated inside.
 - iii. two-story bell tower with four bells.
- April 23, 1809 The Fathers held a Mass to celebrate the new building.

8.1809-1827

- a. Building continued.
 - i. built a Christian Indian village
 - ii. dam on Mission Creek
 - iii. a flour mill, a soap factory, a leather tannery and a two-story living quarters for the Fathers.



History and People of Mission San José

9.1811 - Christian Ohlones started burying their dead at the ancient burial ground. It is now on Washington Boulevard at Paseo Padre Parkway, one mile west of the Mission Church

1821-1826: The Mexican Period Begins

- 1. 1821 Mexico gained independence from Spain.
- 1826 Father Fortuny left after working at Mission San José for 20 years
- 3. Population: 1,783

1827-1832: Indian Resistance, Continued Growth

1. November, 1828

 Father Duran realized that some Indians left the mission and weren't coming back. Estanislao was their leader.

2. Spring, 1829

a. José Sanchez took 30 soldiers and 70 Indians to bring Estanislao back. The runaway Indians used only bows and arrows and a few guns (no bullets) and won the battle.

3. May, 1829

- Alferez Mariano Guadalupe Vallejo brought 100 soldiers from Monterey.
 - i. wanted to help bring the Indians back; big battle.
 - ii. soldiers captured a few people; most of the Indians ran away.
 - iii. soldiers killed many captives; some were old men and women
 - iv. Army said they won and went back to Mission San José


